Or the magic might have come from the carving of name boards, trail boards or stern boards for ships. The wooden transformations may also result in shop signs or decorations meant for the home. It's all in the hands and skill of the wood carver and can be explored in this fun summer camp! Science teacher Dr. O is going "old school" and will introduce students to wood carving, including design, layout, rough cutting, and carving of decorative wood pieces. If time permits we may integrate 3D printing into the prototype phase of your student's project.

In this camp from Youth Digital, kids will create a video game just like designers do in real Game Design studios. They will use Unity®, an industry-standard Game Design software, and C#, a professional programming language, to build and code their game from scratch. At the end of camp, kids will have a complete, fully functional game that they can play and share with friends. They will also be able to access the online version of the course after camp, including video tutorials, interactive quizzes, and new challenges.

As kids code new features in their game, they will learn the most important concepts in programming, including if-then and conditional statements, logical operators, variables, methods, parameters, object types, and loops. They will also learn the fundamental techniques of Game Design, such as navigating and operating within a three-dimensional environment, utilizing prefabs, generating custom particles, simulating artificial intelligence, and more. Not only are the kids using professional tools, but the game they make will look professional too, so they will be excited throughout the week as they create just like the pros!
